Amiga bleibt für viele aber auch ein Stück Biographie. Die alten Scheiben von Renft, den Puhdys oder Manfred Krug sind der Soundtrack ganzer Generationen. - Die Diskographie listet noch einmal alle Rock- und Pop-Platten auf, die Amiga zwischen 1964 und 1990 veröffentlicht hat, vom ersten Yeah, yeah, yeah bis zur Umwandlung der Firma in eine GmbH. Hier finden sich sämtliche LPs, EPs und Singles, gegliedert nach nationalen Produktionen und Lizenzübernahmen. Die Diskographie ist die erste ihrer Art und damit ein unentbehrliches Handbuch für den Fan und Chronisten. In puncto Akribie und Tiefe ist sie ein Novum. Der Nutzer erfährt nicht nur jeden einzelnen Song mit Zeitangabe, Autoren und Musiker, die Namen der Redakteure und Produzenten, der Gestalter und Lizenzgeber, sondern auch Details wie Aufnahmeorte, Veröffentlichungsdaten und Besonderheiten der optischen Ausstattung. Die Diskographie reproduziert jedes einzelne Cover in Schwarzweiß, sie hat einen zusätzlichen, umfangreichen Farbbildteil, ein Titelregister und einen Personenindex.
