Vielmehr sollte der Ratsuchende beim Betreten des Heiligtums die eigene Sterblichkeit und die Hinfälligkeit des Menschen bedenken. Dies

galt in der Antike als wirksames Gegengift zu der damals schon weit verbreiteten Hybris, dem Hochmut. Und heute? In unserer Zeit erheben viele die Optimierung und Verwirklichung des Ichs zu ihrer obersten Maxime. Genau zu wissen, wer man sei und welches Potenzial in einem stecke, helfe bei allen wichtigen Fragen weiter – von der Berufs- bis zur Partnerwahl. Die Selbsterkenntnis soll uns als Kompass dienen, um sicher durch die unruhigen Gewässer des Alltags zu navigieren. Ja, für manche stellt sie sogar den eigentlichen Sinn des Lebens dar.
