STUDENTS TYPICALLY COMPLETE MULTIPLE PRACTICUM HOURS UNDER THE SUPERVISION

OF LICENSED AND CERTIFIED SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGISTS WHO PROVIDE FEEDBACK AND MENTORSHIP.

THE PROGRAM REQUIRES STUDENTS TO ACCUMULATE A MINIMUM NUMBER OF CLINICAL HOURS AS MANDATED BY ASHA, ENSURING ELIGIBILITY FOR THE CERTIFICATE OF CLINICAL COMPETENCE (CCC-SLP). THIS RIGOROUS CLINICAL TRAINING COMPONENT ENHANCES STUDENTS' CONFIDENCE AND COMPETENCE, EQUIPPING THEM TO MEET THE DEMANDS OF PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE IMMEDIATELY UPON GRADUATION.

SPECIALIZED CLINICS AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT
