Wilderson maintains that at the narrative level, they fail to recognize that the turmoil is based not in conflict, but in fundamentally irreconcilable racial antagonisms. Dadurch bietet dieser Streifzug erstmals ein verständliches und klar strukturiertes Bild der unüberschaubaren Megalopolis. Neben umfassenden Informationen über die Stadt und ihre Filme bietet das Buch eine Vielzahl an kurzweiligen Anekdoten sowie einmalige Bilder von den unterschiedlichen Drehorten. Diese neuen Einblicke ermöglichen es allen Kinofans und L.A.-Reisenden, diese faszinierende Großstadt von der Couch oder direkt vor Ort zu erkunden. Der Autor geht auf die Geschichte von L.A. ein und zeigt, welche Aspekte von Los Angeles in Filmen reflektiert werden. Er stellt filmische Locations den realen Orten gegenüber.

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
